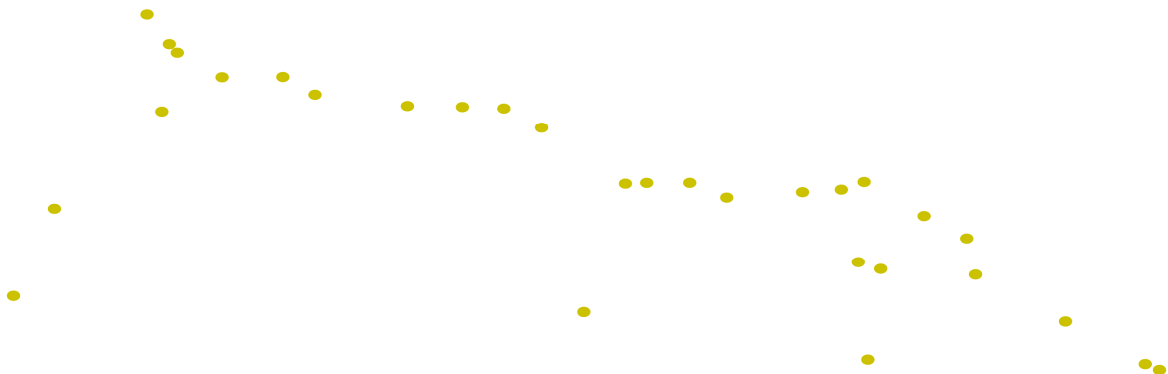


## Discover the Limes!

The map outlines the Limes' approximate location in Roman times. It also shows the locations of the various castella that have since been discovered. Below, you will find an overview of all Limes locations in the Netherlands listed from west to east, with - where available - the Latin name and current Dutch geographical name.

In addition to archaeological finds, contemporary written sources also provide a wealth of information on the Roman era in the Netherlands. The Romans wrote travel guides and kept records of important events. The writings of Tacitus and Suetonius are especially interesting in terms of the Dutch section of the Limes. Peutinger's Map is a very helpful tool in identifying places and routes.

Peutinger's Map dates back to the era of emperor Augustus, but it has come down to us in the form of a twelfth century copy. This road map, featuring all major cities in the Roman Empire also details the distances between the various locations.

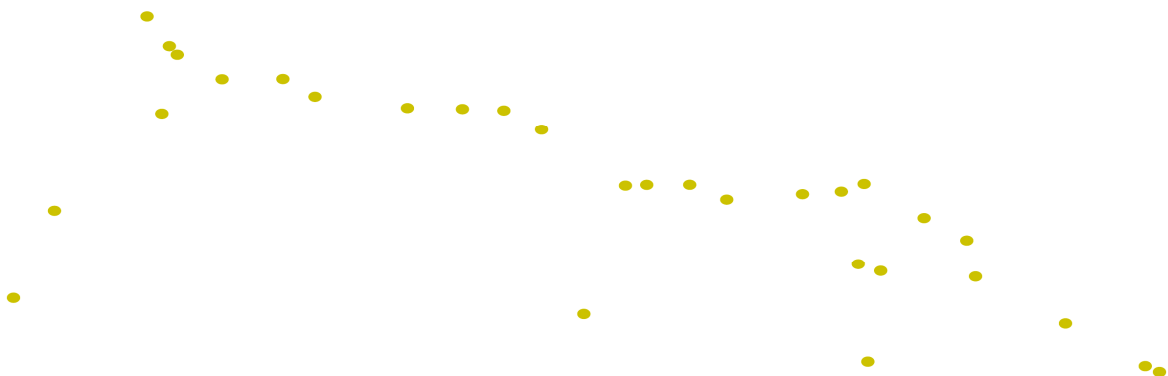
